I presume you are referring to this part of the explanatory note in the Declaration notices:

"A mataitai reserve is a traditional fishing ground for which Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki are appointed under the regulations."

As I understand it, it comes from <u>regulation 2</u> (Interpretation) of the <u>Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing)</u> Regulations 1999:

"mataitai reserve means an identified traditional fishing ground established as a mataitai reserve under regulation 20"

through <u>regulation 20</u> (Declaration of mataital reserve), then to <u>regulation 21(1)</u> (Appointment of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for mataital reserve).

"The Minister must appoint the Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki nominated on the approved form under <u>regulation 17</u> for the corresponding mataitai reserve declared under <u>regulation 20</u>."

Please let me know if this isn't what you were referring to.
