1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

(i) the issue under section 60 of the overseas market access requirements for dogs and cats to Korea, PETANI.KR dated 28 February 2017;

(ii) the revocation and replacement of OMAR B DOMANIEC.KOR: Dogs and cats to Korea dated 1 March 2011;

(iii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for dogs and cats to Korea.

This notice takes effect from 28 February 2017.

2. Korea requirements

Dogs and cats exported from New Zealand to the Korea must be accompanied by an Official Assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

Explanatory Note: If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the dogs and cats do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the dogs and cats do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

NOTES: This certificate replaces that dated 1 March 2013. It has been updated to remove the requirement for residency in New Zealand prior to export.

- 1. An Import Permit is not required
- 2. The number of animals allowed to be imported without prior notification is four animals or less. If more than four animals are to be imported into Korea, then the National Veterinary Research and Quarantine Service branch office of entry need to be informed in advance so that animals can be held in a quarantine area for one day.
- 3. If you are planning on returning to New Zealand with your pet in the future, please contact the animal imports group at MPI to obtain information on importing pets back in New Zealand. We strongly suggest that this is done before your pet is exported from New Zealand as not every country can meet the New Zealand import conditions, and so you may not be able to import your pet back into New Zealand.
